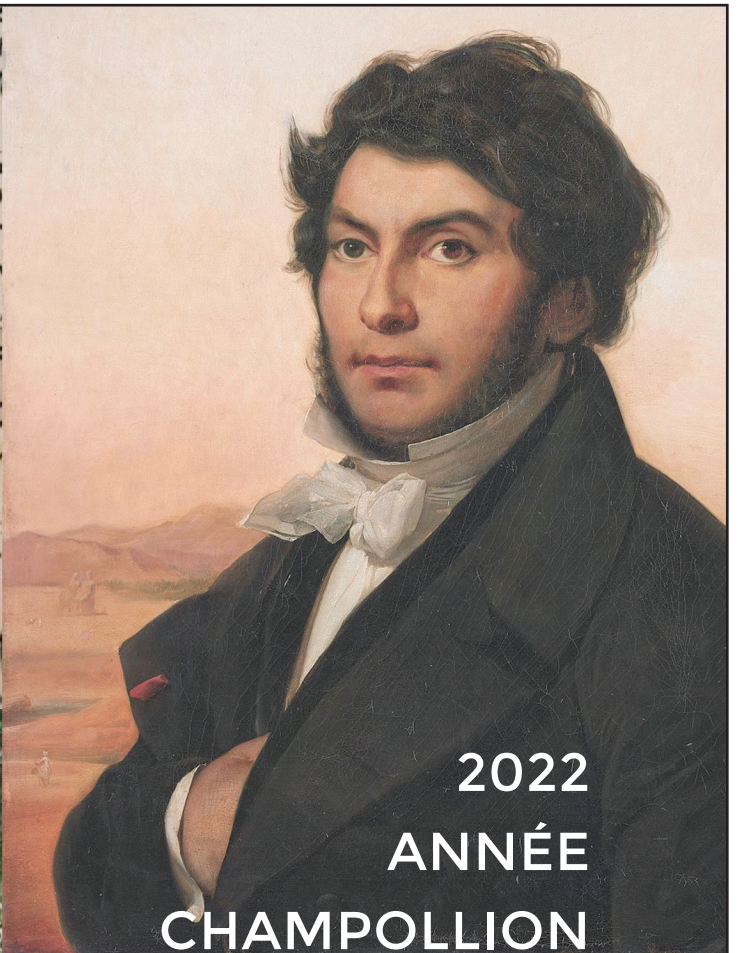
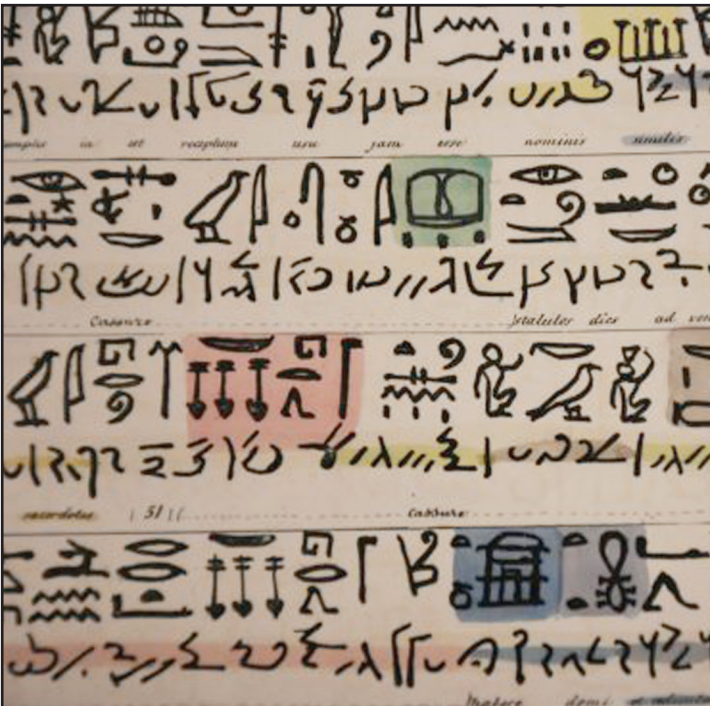

1. Congress venue

The opening and closing ceremonies, as well as the keynote lectures, will be held in a conference room provided by the city of Montpellier, near the University Campus (see the section 3. Plenary sessions).

3. Plenary sessions

All the plenary sessions (opening and closing ceremonies included) will be held at the "Espace Pitot", in the "Salle Guillaume de Nogaret", located Place du Professeur Mirouze. The auditorium is a ten-minute walk from the conference venue. This is a provisional program of the activities that will take place there and it is subject to change. The final version will be released soon.



Day 1 (morning): a welcome coffee, the opening ceremony and two keynote lectures.

Day 2 (afternoon): two keynote lectures

Day 3 (afternoon): two keynote lectures (in association with Société Française d'Égyptologie).

4. Papers format

Oral presentations must be in English and last no longer than **20 minutes**. Each presentation will be followed by a **5-minute Q&A**. Please consider reading a text in order to stay within the allotted time. Speakers are required to follow a strict timing for presentations. As there will be three parallel sessions, participants will have 5 minutes to move from one room to another.

Conscious of the current unstable situation, we offer the possibility to record a video for those speakers that may have difficulty to travel. Please send it to the organizers at **least three days before** the beginning of the conference. The video will be broadcast in the conference room at the time established in the congress program (more information will be provided later). We highly appreciate it if you could update the organizing committee as soon as possible if you are not able to attend in person for organizational issues.

5. Posters format

The posters must be printed in **A0 format** (1189 x 841 mm) only in **vertical orientation**, and preferably in colour. Each author is free to choose the design and layout of the poster, but the following information must be included:

Logos of the CRE and Université Paul-Valéry Montpellier 3 accompanied by the headline “CRE 2022-Université Montpellier 3 - Paul Valéry 26th-30th September 2022” (both logos can be downloaded from CRE website).



Name, institution and email/contact of the author(s).

For those participants who will not be able to travel to Montpellier for the congress, please send by post the poster to the CRE organization in advance. Otherwise, the poster will only be published on the CRE website. We highly appreciate it if you could update the organizing committee as soon as possible if you are not able to attend in person for organizational issues. Please note that **printing and shipping costs are not covered** by the organization.

6. Registration

Registration is now **open only for participants with oral communications or posters**.

Registration for participants is open until **June 20th 2022**.

Registration for attendants without contribution will start during June-July. Details will be given in the third circular to be sent during June-July 2022.

Participants must only register via the platform <https://cre2022.sciencesconf.org/> (see procedures for registration on [this page](#) of the platform, also sent as a pdf with this email). **Registration via e-mail will not be accepted.**

The registration will allow you to choose separately between:

Registration as presentation/poster or attendants. Fees: **33 euros** (unless exonerated)

It includes: welcome pack; attendance to the conference; coffee breaks; welcome drinks with meat and vegetarian options; visit of the historical centre of Montpellier.

Gala dinner. Fees: **22 euros**

Excursion to Marseille and the MUCEM. Fees: **11 euros**

The participants exempted from registration fees should anyway register to be included in the final program. Students and staff from the University Paul-Valéry of Montpellier should provide a valid card of the university to prove their status. Egyptian nationals should provide a valid passport. They must choose the corresponding option during registration. **Proofs of exoneration should be sent by email to cre2022montpellier@gmail.com as soon as you register.**

Please note that the conference dinner and the excursion to Marseille are not included and you should select them in the registration if you wish to attend.

We kindly remind you that accommodation, travel expenses to Montpellier and visa requirements are not covered by the congress organisation in any case.

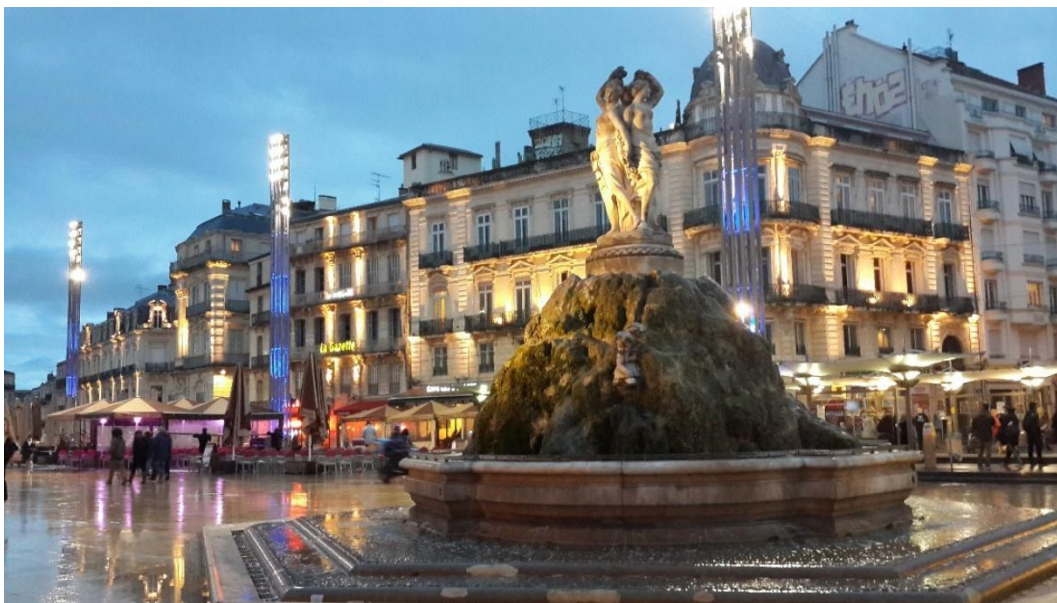
8. Gala dinner

The gala dinner is planned to be held on Tuesday September 27th at the restaurant le Petit Jardin in the city centre of Montpellier, not far from the conference venue. The number of guests is limited, so please register as soon as possible to be guaranteed to attend. Three choices of menu are offered and **should be chosen in advance when registering**:

9. Guided visit to historical centre of Montpellier

A guided tour to the historical centre of Montpellier is planned in the afternoon of Wednesday 28th. It is free for participants and attendants to the conference. The participants will be divided into 2 or 3 groups. The visit will last 1h30 and includes the visit of a medieval mikveh.



10. Visit to Marseille and the MUCEM

On Friday September 30th, the last day of the conference, we will organize an excursion to Marseille. We will leave Montpellier at 9 am and arrive in Marseille at 11 am. We will leave Marseille around 18 pm. In the morning we plan to visit the Mucem (Museum of the civilizations of Europe and the Mediterranean) which will hold the exhibition “Pharaoh superstar”.



The afternoon will be free. Marseille offers many possibilities (culture, nature, shopping...), for example, to have a walk along the “Vieux Port”, to eat an ice cream on a sunny terrace on the seaside or to visit the Chateau d’If (an island transformed into a fortress in the 16th century which was the place of imprisonment of Edmond Dantès in Alexandre Dumas’ novel: *The Count of Monte Cristo*).

It is also nice to have a few hours boat trip to visit the wild Massif des Calanques or to visit other museums of Roman and Greek history, or even Egyptology (Musée de la Vieille Charité,

The excursion is optional and we will ask you to confirm your participation when you register for the conference.

11. Visa

Please, for participants coming from non-EU countries, bear in mind to check the conditions for entering France from your country of origin well in advance. In case that you need a visa document, you should contact the French Embassy or Consulate in your country. Do not hesitate to contact us in case you need an invitation letter from the University.

As the conference draws nearer, we will keep you updated on the current Covid situation in France, but you should check on your own the conditions for entering France from your country of origin. In any case, it is probable that proof of vaccination or a valid PCR test will be expected.

12. Transportation to Montpellier

For travellers who come by flight

First of all, the airport “Montpellier-Méditerranée”, 8 km from the city centre, operates with many low-cost companies. There are direct flights from Paris, Berlin, Amsterdam, Lisbon, London etc.

A shuttle (1,60€) is available between the airport and the city of Montpellier. It leads to the stop “Place de l’Europe” in the Antigone district. Across the street you will find the stop for tramlines 1 and 4.

At a 2-hour drive from Montpellier, there is another airport that offers even more destinations with two terminals: “Marseille Provence” and “Marseille Provence 2 (MP2)”, the latter being exclusively reserved for low-cost companies.

The bus station is located outside, not even 50m from either of these terminals, and allows you to reach Montpellier quickly.

Please note that you will have to book this bus ticket separately with the transport companies: BlaBlaCar Bus, Flixbus, Oui.SNCF, etc. for an average price of 2€ to 15€.

Others airports around Montpellier: Nîmes, Béziers, Perpignan and Toulouse.

For travellers who come by train

The railway company operating in France is the SNCF. Other companies also have connections with France, such as RENFE, Frecciarossa... We advise you to check the available connections with the companies of your country of departure.

In Montpellier there are two stations

“Gare Montpellier Sud-de-France”, 8km from the city centre. On the exterior square of the station, there is a shuttle between the station and tram line 1 (stop “Place de France”) which allows you to go to the city centre and connect with the other tram lines.

“Gare Saint-Roch”, in the city centre. The four tramway lines (1, 2, 3 and 4) connecting Montpellier to the outlying villages (and one of them gets to the beach!) are all passing through “Gare Saint-Roch”.

There are also many bus lines that serve different areas of Montpellier. From station “Gare Saint-Roch”, you can find three of them:



Bus line 6 = to “Euromédecine” or “Pas du Loup”

Bus line 7 = to “La Martelle/les Bouisses” or “Hôtel du Département”

Bus line 11 = to “Tournezy” or “Les Bouisses”

At the tram stop “Place de France”, where the shuttle from “Gare Montpellier Sud de France” arrives, you will also find a bus line connecting to different areas of the city:

Bus line 15 = Pompignane, Aiguelongue, Saint Eloi, Celleneuve, les Cévennes, Les Bouisses, Croix d’Argent, Sabines.

For travellers who come by bus

From here you can take the tramway line 2 direction “Notre-Dame-de-Sablassou”/”Jacou” which will take you directly to the city centre.

For travellers who come by car

Montpellier is on the A9 expressway which connects Spain to Italy.

If you are travelling on the A9 expressway, there are four possible exits to Montpellier:

Exit 28 (North) Baillargues (Vendargues exit)

Exit 29 (East): différents Montpellier districts : le Millénaire, le Zénith, Odysseum, “Montpellier Méditerranée” Airport

Exit 30 (South): City centre, access to Place de la Comédie, Montpellier Saint-Roch train Station, and of course the **conference venue**

Exit 31 (West)

13. Getting around in Montpellier

The Saint-Charles site where the 2022 CRE will take place is in the heart of the Montpellier city centre, in the oldest part of this medieval city, and it is close to many hotels and restaurants.

Montpellier is the only city in France where the student population is greater than the inhabitants, life is cheap, pleasant and festive. You will find everything you need within walking distance or by tramway: a walk in the old town or at the beach, exhibitions of photography, classical or contemporary art, but also concerts and festivals.



Montpellier is ready to welcome you for an intense week of Egyptology and leisure. For more information.

Some details on urban transport

Upon your arrival, you can buy either one-way tickets for 1,60€ or a ten-trips ticket for 10€ at every tramway station. The tickets are valid for buses and tramways, in case of connection your ticket is valid within 1 hour after the first validation.

If your accommodation is close to the city centre, you can easily walk around. You may want to check that before buying tickets. All venues from the congress itself are closeby and accessible by foot.

How to get to the Conference venue

Please bear in mind that the Université Paul-Valéry Montpellier 3 has two campus (in Route de Mende and in Site Saint-Charles). **Make sure you are going to the correct campus:** Université Paul-Valéry Montpellier 3 - Site Saint-Charles (avenue Saint-Charles) = tramway station “Place Albert 1^{er}/Saint Charles” (Ligne 1) and “Place Albert 1er/Cathédrale” (Ligne 4). The Saint-Charles site is located northwest of the Écusson (the name given to the historic city centre), only a 20-minute walk from the “Montpellier Saint-Roch” train station (located south of the Écusson) and a 30-minute walk from the “Place de l’Europe” tramway station.

Some examples of tramway routes to the conference venue

By Ligne 1 Tramway

From “Montpellier Saint-Roch” (exterior square of the train station) to “Place Albert 1er/Saint-Charles” (direction: “Mosson/Occitanie”): 10 minutes.

By Ligne 4 Tramway

From “Montpellier Saint-Roch” (exterior square of the TGV station) to “Place Albert 1er/Cathédrale” (direction: “Garcia Lorca”): 8 minutes.

By Ligne 1 Tramway

From “Place de l’Europe” to “Place Albert 1er/Saint-Charles” (direction: “Mosson/Occitanie”): 18 minutes.

By Ligne 4 Tramway

From “Place de l’Europe” to “Place Albert 1er/Cathédrale” (direction: “Garcia Lorca”): 12 minutes.

By Ligne 1 Tramway

“Place de France” to “Place Albert 1er/Saint-Charles” (direction: “Mosson/Occitanie”): 26 minutes.

Some hotels require a credit card to book a room, but you can cancel up to the day before and you will pay on check-in. The prices mentioned are for a room. Don't be surprised when you arrive at the hotel to pay a slightly higher price: there is a tourist tax of 1,50€ per night and per person in France.
